- 22 days gone – 7% of your GCSE time
- 312 to go (not taking into account days lost to trips, events, work experience and internal exams – that's probably about 20 days)

# Impact of Attendance

<b>Less than 80%</b>	<b>-1.41</b>
<b>80% - 89% Attendance</b>	<b>-0.24</b>
<b>90% - 95% Attendance</b>	<b>0.1</b>
<b>96% or more Attendance</b>	<b>0.55</b>

# What can students be doing?

- Regularly revisiting notes – there is a much greater emphasis on memory and the ability to recall now. If this becomes self-generated it will help so that everything is not left until Year 11
- Making sure homework tasks are done thoroughly and well – these are often opportunities to practise exam technique and receive valuable feedback – the more you put in, the more you will get out
- Getting the balance right – pace yourself and make sure you maintain other interests
- Think carefully about work experience
- Making the most of lessons – use **reflection opportunities** fully
