

Pupil Premium Case Studies 2020

1: Student A, Year 11 leaver 2020. Started at Priory in Year 7. PPI due to being LAC from Year 8. Issues - social and emotional impacting on ability to concentrate in school, causing internal exclusions. Strategies employed using PPI funding – 1 to 1 weekly mentoring with Smashlife, 1 to 1 support with college application, bespoke college visit, revision materials purchased, music lessons, 1 to 1 careers visit. Outcomes – attendance increased to 100 % in 2019/20 academic year, no fixed term exclusions in 2019/20. Studying BTEC at Shrewsbury College.

2: Student B, Year 11 leaver 2020. Started at Priory in Year 10. PPI due to being Post LAC. Number of GCSE's reduced to allow study catch up time. Strategies employed using PPI funding -weekly pastoral support from student support, 1 to 1 study sessions in school time, bespoke college visit, support with college application, revision materials purchased. Outcomes – arrived with targets of 3 in maths and English, gained 7 GCSEs at grade 4 or above, including maths and English. Now studying Level 3 BTEC at Shrewsbury College.

3. Student C. Year 11 leaver 2020. Started Priory in Year 7. PP due to being FSM. Social and emotional challenges owing to family dynamic, impacting confidence and health. Strategies employed using PP funding – collaborative working with social worker, 1-1 weekly mentoring with Smash Life, bespoke PE lessons (yoga and mindfulness), weekly sessions with Teenage Health Advisor. Financial support with trips, uniform and revision materials. Outcomes – social work intervention ceased. Health improved. Mental health improved. Improved family dynamics. Studying BTEC at Shrewsbury College.

4. Student D. Year 11 Leaver 2020. Started Priory in Year 7. PP due to being FSM. MAP. Strategies to support student utilising PP funding – financial assistance with revision materials, school uniform and trips – including University visit and taster day at Oxford University. Impact – opportunities and experiences that would not have been financially available. Studying A levels at Shrewsbury College.
