Please be aware that these results are based on Centre Assessed Grades rather than standardised GCSE results.

All GCSE subjects are now graded 1 to 9 with a 4 equivalent to a C and designated as a Standard Pass. A grade 5 is equivalent to the top end of a C grade or the lower end of a B grade and is designated a Strong Pass.

The EBacc is a measure which recognises students who achieve at least a pass in all of the following: English, Maths, Science, a Language and History OR Geography.

The A8 (Attainment 8) score is the point score achieved by students on average across their best 8 subjects. This is calculated by adding up the points for their best 6 subjects plus English and Maths, whose scores are doubled.

The Progress 8 score is calculated by comparing each student's Attainment 8 score to those nationally of other students who had the same KS2 SATs results. This is designed to measure how much progress each student has made from Year 6 to Year 11. A school's Progress 8 score is usually between -1 and +1. A score of +1 means that pupils in that school achieve one grade higher in each qualification than other similar pupils nationally. A score of -1 means they achieve one grade lower.

The average Progress 8 score of all secondary schools nationally is 0. Schools with a Progress 8 score of below -0.5 are not achieving the minimum standard expected by the Government. A score of +0.5 or above shows that pupils in that school are making well above the expected level of progress.
