Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome to our first spring term newsletter. I hope you find it a useful insight into life at school.

We are looking forward to welcoming many of you into school for our annual school production, High School Musical. The cast have been tirelessly rehearsing with Miss Jones and Mr Austin; it is set to be one of our best yet. If you haven't already purchased your tickets, this can be completed through ParentPay.

Year 11 have been working hard post mock exams and are leading by example in and out of the classroom. Any revision or intervention sessions are published in their planner if you want to encourage their attendance. Some sessions may be by invitation only at this stage, but this will not be the case for all subjects; please ask your child to speak to their class teacher if they need any clarification. Their final exam timetable will be published and sent out next half term once these are finalised by the exam boards, based on our entries.

It has been good to see our attendance levels pick up as a school, despite the illnesses that were circulating during the Christmas period. Thank you for your support with this. We are focusing on punctuality to school at the moment as this has slipped for some students. A reminder that it is important that all students are on site no later than 8.30am so they can be ready for registration at 8.35am. Morning registration is an important part of the day for checking pupils have everything they need for the day ahead as well as receiving messages to do with the school day. We will be focusing on anyone who is signing in late after the end of registration without a valid reason such as a medical appointment. We would love all students to come to school that day dressed as a character from a favourite book, either full costume or with a small prop that gives us a flavour of that character. World Book Day is part of our year-round drive to promote reading with students. We have a very well-stocked library with enthusiastic and experienced librarians. Reading has so many benefits, from developing creativity to increasing vocabulary — please continue to encourage your son/daughter to borrow and read books, either from our school library or from Shrewsbury Library in town.






Holocaust Memorial Day

Futures Focus



A quick update on the careers activities for this half term and what is coming up

Year 10 visit to University of Birmingham

Fifty Year 10 students visited University of Birmingham in January to learn more about university life. They met with students who were able to answer their questions, had a tour of the facilities at the university, and learnt about the huge range of different courses that are available to undergraduates. They learnt about the importance of GCSE results for their university applications, and the 2.7 million books in the library and impressive sports facilities certainly showed the scale of the resources available at higher education.

Year 10 university finance talk

University of Chester visited The Priory School to give a presentation to all Year 10 students about university finance. They covered the difference between tuition and maintenance loans and how these are paid back over many years depending on income levels. The overriding message was: whilst university isn't for everyone, it should be affordable for everyone.

Department for Work and Pensions talks

The DWP delivered talks this half term, focusing on labour market information (LMI) and 'What employers want'. Year 8 learnt more about the local labour market, in particular within Shropshire and Herefordshire, and which jobs are predicted to grow over the coming years. Year 9 focused on the importance of employability skills and why these are so important to securing a job — as the DWP said, qualifications will get you the interview, but it's your employability skills that will get you the job.

National Apprenticeship Week

As part of National Apprenticeship Week, SBC Training delivered an assembly to all Key Stage 3 about apprenticeships. They covered the different types and huge variety of apprenticeships available to students both at 16 and beyond.

All Year 10 students took part in our annual apprenticeship event where they heard from young apprentices, including degree level, about their journeys and why they chose apprenticeships. Learning first hand from apprentices gives valuable information to help with their decision-making in the future.

Shrewsbury School University Fair

Over thirty Year 11 students attended Shrewsbury School University Fair, where they had the opportunity to speak with over forty different universities as well as gap year and overseas providers. Whilst many students are not sure exactly what they want to do, gathering so much information, understanding the importance of GCSE results and A Level choices will help students make informed decisions over the coming years.

Year 9

- Apprenticeship and Employability Skills Show, Telford 50 students will have the chance to talk to
 employers about many different types of apprenticeships and probably collect a few free gifts too!
- Employability Skills event students will have the opportunity to develop their team working and problem solving skills in workshops

Year 10

- Army Elite Skills Workshop a talk from The Army about different careers and then a chance to
 develop their employability skills through a range of activities, including walking through a 'minefield'
 blindfolded and passing a team through a net without touching the sides.
- Bank of England 40 students will have the opportunity to learn more about the Bank of England and
 careers within that sector from Michael Marsh who will be visiting from the Bank of England.
